<p><b>HB 4467 : Require Fetal Heartbeat Detection Before Abortion</b></p> <p>This bill would require that physicians attempt to detect a fetal heartbeat before performing an abortion. <p><b>HB 4877 : Define Pregnant Person Addiction as Child Abuse</b></p> <p>This bill would specify that someone who is pregnant and addicted to substance that harms their fetus or poses "an unreasonable risk of harm" to the fetus is guilty of child abuse. <p><b>HB 5750/5751/5953/5954 : Extend Safe Delivery of Newborns Time and Establish Newborn Safety Devices</b></p> <p>These bills revise the Safe Delivery of Newborns law so that newborns could be surrendered up to 30 days old (vs. the current limit of 3 days).
