<p>HB 4282 : Allow Exemption from Health Education Requirement</p> <p>This bill would allow students in career and technical education (CTE) programs to substitute 30 hours of Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) training for their health education graduation requirement. <p>SB 270 : Expand Affirmative Consent and Sexual Assault/Dating Violence Education Requirements</p> <p>This bill would expand on current requirements for sex education content. It would require that curriculum around healthy relationships include more comprehensive discussions about affirmative consent, sexual assault, and dating violence. SB 270 modifies the language in in sections (f) and (i) of the A-K sex education content standards.
